

# Creative Curriculum Sharing Event

On **Friday 9<sup>th</sup> June 2017** the whole school came together in the hall to celebrate the end of the Creative Curriculum Topic: Our Environment.

The Sharing Event began with a performance from **Year 6** who had been learning about popular music from the 1960s. They had collaborated as a class to write their own song based on what they had learned from listening to a selection of songs from the sixties. The song featured some historical events from the life of the school as well as their feelings as the class prepare to leave to move on to their Secondary Schools. The whole class were involved in the performance with a leading group of ukulele players, the baseline from the double bass and a large group of percussion and singers. A fantastic song and performance from Year 6.



This sharing took the form of a skills share and once again, the Year groups then partnered up to teach their new skills to pupils from another class. **Year 2 and Year 5** shared their Geography skills. Year 2 taught their partners how to find human and physical features on a map and Year 5 explained that humans often make an impact on the environment in the form of road building.





Art and Design and Design Technology experts in **Year 1 and Year 4** joined together to share their skills. Year 4 had been learning about the environmental themes in the work of William Morris and they demonstrated how to use grids to copy designs carefully and scale up the images. Year 1 challenged their partners with some tricky cutting, folding and fixing skills- all the skills needed for building their own houses.



**Reception Class** shared what they had learnt about toys and games from the past with Year 6. They played these games together and had great fun.



Once again the children enjoyed sharing their skills and being the teachers for a morning. Well done everyone!
