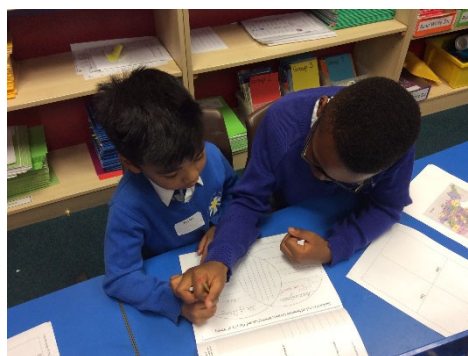
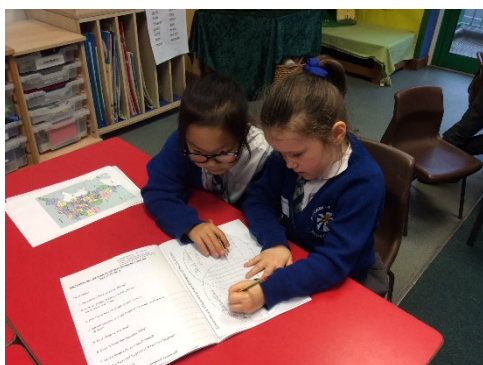


# Community Skills Sharing

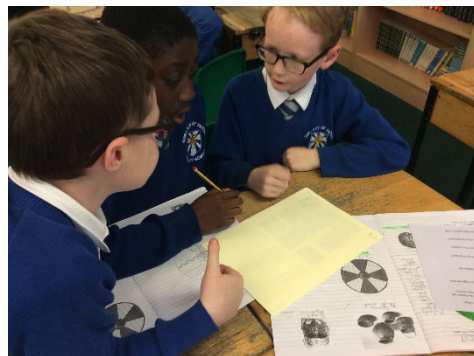
