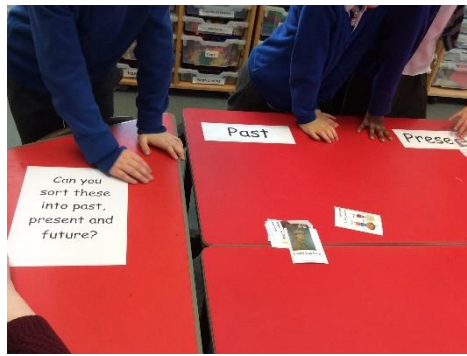


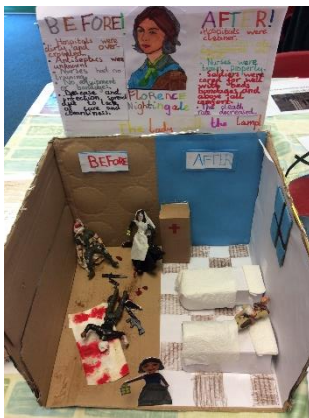
Leaders Sharing Event Spring 2018

On **Thursday 8th March 2018** pupils gathered in classrooms ready for the Spring Sharing Event, where each Year group shared their learning in the form of an exhibition. 'Leaders' was the theme for our sharing and this time History and Geography were the main subject areas; it was so good to see how pupils have developed in their understanding of these subjects.

Year 1 had been learning about two leaders of Art: Pieter Bruegel the Elder and L.S. Lowry. They showed the visitors some of their own paintings in the style of these artists and explained the features clearly. We all enjoyed listening to "Matchstick Men and Matchstick Cats and Dogs" by Brian and Michael too!



Year 2 had been learning about three nursing leaders: Mary Seacole, Florence Nightingale and Edith Cavell. They explained some of the similarities between these important leaders and showed how they lived out many of our Christian virtues. The children proudly showed their research and models that were completed as homework tasks.





Year 3 had Egyptians as their main topic and the children enthusiastically shared their learning in their Creative Curriculum books. One of the highlights was their amazing Egyptian Canopic jars (complete with gory contents!)



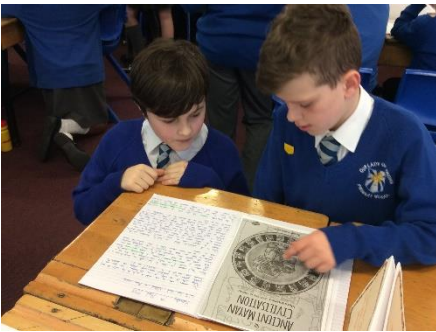
